NORTHRIDGE STUDENT WINS \$2,000 DISCUS SCHOLARSHIP

Sarine Shahmirian named this month's scholarship winner by The Discus Awards, a new national program honoring multi-talented students who demonstrate excellence both inside and outside of school

Northridge, CA (March 4, 2010) – Sarine Shahmirian, a senior at Chaminade College Preparatory in West Hills, today became this month's recipient of The Discus Scholarship, a national college scholarship that provides \$2,000 to ten multi-talented high school students each year who demonstrate excellence both inside and outside of school.

An award-winning classical pianist, Sarine also holds the highest cumulative GPA in her class and was named a National Merit Commended student. But her intellectual achievements go far beyond test scores.

As a student at the prestigious Southern California Academy of Sciences (SCAS), Sarine was awarded a research grant to work at an organic chemistry lab at California State University, Northridge. Her research won first place over that submitted by university students and post-docs competing in the chemistry/biochemistry section of last summer's American Association for the Advancement of Sciences Pacific Division meeting.

Sarine epitomizes the mission of The Discus Awards (www.DiscusAwards.com), the organization behind The Discus Scholarship. Launched earlier this year, The Discus Awards look beyond test grades and athletics to recognize students whose multi-dimensional talents and passions span at least three of ten attributes, including community service, work, technology, athletics, academics, and the arts.
